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SEATS OF HONOR

Luke recorded five of the seven <u>Sabbath miracles</u> perform by Jesus as prophetic signs to Israel of their Messianic Savior (Isa.61:1-3; Lk.7:22-23; 14:1-6, **13**) (Luke Chapters 4; 6; 13; 14; John 5; and 9).

We will divide our lesson text into three parts of study.

- (Lk.14:1-6) The Story
- (Lk.14:7-11) The Parable
- (Lk.14:12-14) The Explanation of the doctrinal point (Lk.14:11)
- 1. We will begin by examining the Story by the following four homiletic points (Lk.14:1-6).

• Pharisee dinner party (Lk.14:1) Sabbath (Lk.7:6-8) Prominent leader (Sanhedrin)

• Pretense of interest in Jesus (Lk.14:2) Sabotage (Lk.20:19-21) "They watched Him closely."

• Planted person with dropsy (Lk.14:2) Sickness (Num.5:19-22)

• Profaning Mosaic Law (Lk.14:3-6) Speechless (2 questions) (Gen.50:20; Isa.5:20)

- 2. Now we will examine the parable of a wedding dinner by the following four homiletic points (Lk.14:7-11) [Addressed to those invited].
 - Assigning seats (Lk.14:7) Places of honor [Last Supper]
 - o (Lk.22:24) "He noticed how they had been picking out the places of honor at the table."
 - **Assumption** (Lk.14:8-9) Preeminence (Prov.25:6-7; Lk.11:43)
 - **Assessment** (Lk.14:10) Prestige for host as well as guests (Matt.23:6, 12)
 - Assimilate (Lk.14:11) Parable doctrinal point
 - o (Lk.18:9-14) "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted." (Prov.29:23; Matt.23:12; James 4:10)
 - False humility Seats of honor
 - Genuine humility Seat unnoticed (Prov.22:4; 18:12) [humility goes before honor]
 - Enforced humility Removed

- 3. Finally, we will examine Jesus' explanation of the parable doctrinal point by the following three homiletic points (Lk.14:12-14) [Addressed to the host after the parable].
 - **Reciprocation** (Lk.14:12) Looking for repayment of favor.
 - o "He went on to say to the one who had invited Him." (Note four groups) (Matt.6:1)

[&]quot;True honor is not what one claims for himself; but what is conferred on him by others."

- **Recluses** (Lk.14:13) Doesn't look for repayment or favor (Luke 4:16-21)
 - o (Isa.61:1-2a)" Set free those who are oppressed" (thrauo) (perf.p.ptc.aplm) [break into pieces, to shatter dropsy] (**Note difference of these four groups**)

Do you see the importance of genuine humility is no respecter of persons?

- **Reward** (Lk.14:14) Looking for Blessed (makarios) favor in eternity
 - o (Lk.14:15) "When one of those who were reclining at the table with Hi heard this, he said to Him, 'Blessed is everyone who will eat bread in the kingdom of God.""
 - o This led to a spin-off parable (Lk.14:16-24)

A sign of spiritual growth maturity is seeking the honor that comes from God.

(Prov.29:23) "A man's pride will bring him low, but a humble spirit will obtain honor."

This Story Parable points out the danger of the <u>mental attitude sin</u> (MAS) of **respecter of persons** (Lev.19:15-18; Matt.22:34-40; Lk.**10:29-37**) [Good Samaritan] (James 2:1-9) [Royal law] (Rom.13:10; Acts 10:34-36).

The Church Age Believer (CAB) can please God, but not earn His respect (Heb.11:6).

God's respect is found in the genuine humility of His Beloved Son who suffered the cross for every member of the human race (Phil. 2:8-11).

Pharisees asked Jesus' disciples, "Why do you eat and drink with the tax collectors and sinners?"

Jesus answered, "It is not those who are well who need a physician, but those who are sick. I have NOT come to call the righteous but sinners to repentance." (Lk.5:30-32)

NOTE: Genuine humility is extended by grace ministry to all equally without respecter of persons or expectation of benefit in return.
